Seven students get daily help with targeted skills. The only complaint about these efforts is the desire for more time with each student.

Ended 2020 school year with 85% above grade level so started with year with a big hit - only 50% on grade level. Big drop off due to COVID and also possibly Jeanie's departure.

SSR - time in class to read is making a big difference.

School is looking how to make reading program better. Possibly a literacy coach for the western schools? Lisa Jensen (current literacy coach?) doesn't show her face in PV at all.

Question asked if every family has access to internet. Answer: no, not all families have internet. District can provide hot spots but they are not working very well.

Teachers are excited for the next round of testing. Hoping to follow upward trend. Some students have set individual goals and are working hard at school and at home. One student zooms every night to read with her grandma.

2. Utah Compose Data

CC member really wanted to work on spelling, writing, etc... because that's a job skill.

Work on different writing styles: narrative, informative, etc...

Goal is 23 (highest score possible is 30). Middle Room BOY score average was 12. Most recent scores from Middle Room: 7 out of 10 students scored 20 or higher so getting much closer to goal (one student scored 28/30!). Big Room BOY average was 16 - now scores are 23 or 24 range.

- On-line learning update/Corona Virus effects to date

Students are dealing with masks well, all things considered. Each classroom has a pig mister for sanitizing. District is going to be providing clear masks for the teachers (so students can see the teacher's mouths). From donations, each student has been given a few masks.

- Student enrollment and staffing

36 total students this year

Lots of staffing changes... Mr. Briant Hall hired as K-2 teacher. Kelly B Kunzler (w/ Bruce Pugsley as aide) take over Middle Room in the afternoons (so Melissa Morris can fulfilled administrative responsibilities). Kaylee Jones has been hired as custodian, and her husband Seth is a volunteer helping her with this job. Sally Pugsley is no longer the cook – she is now an IVC facilitator and the special ed instructor. Jean Morris is still a bus driver but also the cook this year.

- Carnival discussion

Due to COVID restrictions, the carnival will be held outside this year. The date is October 30^{th} at 4 p.m.

Food will need to be catered (planning to use Kunzler Katering). Possibly plan to serve from the bowery (service district has approved this). Also use nice picnic tables from the bowery (spread out to 'social distance').

Instead of the tradition silent auction and live auction at the carnival, PTO plans to do a Facebook silent auction prior to the carnival. Donations will be delivered to the school one week before the carnival (need to sit untouched for three days to be considered sanitized). For those without Facebook, PTO will encourage monetary donations or offer to bid in behalf of that person.

Traditional carnival games will be spread around the park. Each game will have a pig mister and will be sanitized between families.

Council discussed pros and cons of Trick or Treat versus Trunk or Treat and agreed upon Trick or Treat Saturday Oct 31st. PTO will create list of households that want to participate (and also encourage "lights on" or "lights off"). PTO will also strongly encourage store bought and pre-packaged candy.

Treat Trot possibly in the rodeo arena.

Hallie has a speaker system that could help, just needs an outlet.

- Budget of PTO and how funds will be used this year. Requests by school staff Hallie has requested and been promised \$1000 from the PTO for roller skates. School is still looking for a bench to put in the hallway.

Hallie would like a new start gun to the track meet – not a super high priority but will be helpful sometime – will cost approximately \$200-300.

Biggest need right now is a 3-step ladder for the Little Room to use in an emergency to access the window. PTO will purchase asap.

Personal earphones and mice for each student was the goal for this school year but are back ordered until April.

- Update on backpacks (to be filled)

This project has been taken care of and the bags were updated during the spring.

- Net Safety?

No longer called Net Safety. New program is "Digital Respons-ABILITY" 6 classes for K-6th, 8 classes for 7th-12th, and a parent training seminar Melissa Morris will make initial call to begin scheduling

- Fieldtrips?

Fieldtrips have been suspended until further notice due to COVID-19.
